Message from the SAHS President

Time sure has a way of continually moving on. I am already completing my seventh year as the Salem Area Historical Society's President. We continue to make progress on our mission of preserving the past for the future. This year of 2013 saw a lot of accomplishments for our Society. All of these are only possible by the talents and efforts of our membership.

It might be too numerous to list all of the 2013 accomplishments and I might forget to mention some of them, but I would like to at least list the major accomplishments of the SAHS for 2013.

1. The establishment of the Jarvis Stone School Local Historic District by the passing of the LHD Ordinance by the Washtenaw County Board of Commissioners on June 5, 2013 has to be the most important of all of them. This was a great SAHS volunteer effort that lasted over two years. Our Vice President was the driving force for this project. Without Marcia's enthusiasm and drive, this may have never occurred. She rallied the members and sought out the volunteers who became the Jarvis Stone School Historic District Study Committee. This committee worked diligently to produce the Study Report that documented the historical significance and current state of our property. This Study Report was the basis for the approval of the district. This designation will be an additional protection in our effort to preserve these buildings. The Society is indebted to the members of Study Committee and thanks them for all of their efforts. They are Jean Bemish, Cynthia Christensen, Terry Cwik, Sue DiMilia, Helen Gierman, Jane Griffith, Melissa Milton-Pung, Marie Turppa and Marcia Van Fossen.

2. The Jarvis Stone School Front Room Renovation Project will be completed with the installation of the cabinets and countertops in December. This was another multi-year project that started in 2008 and had many volunteers, who logged more than 420 hours on the project. These volunteer efforts have turned the front addition of the School into a beautiful and useable area. A special thank you goes to Jim DiMilia who was key to getting it completed. The SAHS Board would also like to thank all of the following volunteers for their efforts on this project: Mike Brautigan, Terry Cwik, Diane Cwik, Jim DiMilia, Karl Gierman, Jeff Kugel, Ron McGinnis, Gregg Packard and Wayne Wallazy.

3. The completion of Dickerson Barn Project with the issuing of the Certificate of Occupancy by Salem Township on August 26th. This effort was started in 1999 and the volunteers who helped complete this are indeed too numerous to list. However, I must mention at least these three, who were instrumental in accomplishing this: Meroë

Allen Kaericher, Don Riddering and Gilbert Terry. Without their efforts, the Dickerson Barn would not have been saved and relocated to the SAHS property.

4. The continuation of our major annual fund raising events: Dinner/Auction, Yard Sale, Art & Craft Fair and Barn Dance.

5. The continuation of the presentations at the SAHS meetings. Way to go, Marcia!

6. The four Open Houses at the Jarvis Stone School.

7. The All-classes South Salem Stone School Reunion.

As one can see, 2013 was quite a successful year!

With that, I look forward to continuing our efforts of preserving the past for the future with new projects for 2014. The two new major efforts for 2014 are the documenting of the SAHS archives and the obtaining a State of Michigan Historic Marker for the South Salem Stone School.

The first has already begun with the volunteering of three to help in this effort. Gilbert Terry, the Chairman of the Historical Archive Committee, will lead this effort. If you would like to join Karl Williams and Nancy Kiernan, who have already volunteered to assist, please contact Gilbert or me. The initial effort will be to establish a regular meeting time of a couple of hours per month. Next will be to gather and review the methods available to document the archives. This will include contacting other local Historical Societies in order to assess their process and its applicability for our use. After a process is selected, documented and tested, the regular meeting hours will be used to go through all of the SAHS archives and follow the newly established process. I encourage you to consider volunteering a few hours a month for this project that will greatly benefit our efforts in preserving the past for the future.

The second one is somewhat a continuation of the Local Historic Project in that it adds another Historic Recognition for the school. The State of Michigan Historic Marker will use the LHD Study Report as its starting point.

Our 2013 Annual SAHS Memberships end on March 31, 2014. 2014 Annual Memberships are now being accepted. Please see our membership renewal form on Page 6. Use it to renew and to recruit new members to SAHS.

In October, the Washtenaw County Historic District Commission inspected our Jarvis Stone School and documented its condition as a part of its annual Local Historic District Audit. This report stated "entire property is well kept and the school was in great repair."

Dickerson Barn Update

Ken Brock has built and installed the small wood ramps for the transition from the dirt ramp to the barn floor. On August 26th, Salem Township issued SAHS the Certificate of Occupancy for the Dickerson Barn. The next step for the Dickerson Barn is to develop a plan that SAHS can implement that will make the barn an exhibit center explaining the farming community that existed in Salem during the 19th century.
