SAHS 2015 Elections

Salem Area Historical Society will be holding its annual elections as per its By-Laws during the first quarter of 2015. Articles IV, V and VI address this process. As has been done in the past, we will follow the process as specified in our By-Laws. At the SAHS January 28st meeting, we appointed Helen Gierman as the Chairperson of the nominating committee. If you would like to be on this committee, please contact here or one of the current officers of the society. Prior to our February 25th meeting, members who would like to nominate themselves to be a nominee for office should contact either the nominating committee or a current officer. All nominations must be self-nominating and all are accepted. A member need not be present at the February meeting to be a nominee. Nominations from the floor will be accepted at the February 25th meeting. The 2015 election will be held during our March 28th meeting. A nominee need not be present to be elected.

There is at least one opening for a new member to the Board. Would you consider and be willing to nominate yourself for SAHS Secretary or Member-At-Large?

The term of Office is from the March 2015 SAHS Meeting until the 2016 SAHS March Meeting.

The duties of the SAHS Secretary are:

- 1. Retain and Maintain the SAHS Secretary Records (currently a couple of binders).
- 2. Record the minutes of SAHS Board Meetings and place them into the SAHS Secretary Records.
- 3. Record the minutes of SAHS Meetings and place them into the SAHS Secretary Records.
- 4. Record and maintain other SAHS records as required and place them into the SAHS Secretary Records (Usually only a few items per year).
- 5. If unable to attend a SAHS Board Meeting or a SAHS Meeting, authorize someone else to record the minutes.
- 6. Attend as many as possible SAHS Board Meetings (usually there are two and no more than three per year).
- 7. Attend as many as possible SAHS Meetings (usually there are seven or eight per year).
- 8. Propose resolutions to the SAHS Board.
- 9. Vote on resolutions by the SAHS Board.
- 10. Communicate with the other SAHS Board Members via email, phone and in person.
- 11. Honestly represent the SAHS when speaking on behalf of the SAHS.

The duties of the SAHS Member-At-Large are:

- 1. Attend as many as possible SAHS Board Meetings (usually there are two and no more than three per year).
- 2. Attend as many as possible SAHS Meetings (usually there are seven or eight per year).
- 3. Propose resolutions to the SAHS Board.
- 4. Vote on resolutions by the SAHS Board.
- 5. Communicate with the other SAHS Board Members via email, phone and in person.
- 6. Honestly represent the SAHS when speaking on behalf of the SAHS.

The Rider House

Landmark: The Rider House Location: Parking Lot of Salem Township Hall on Six Mile Road in Salem Hamlet of Salem Township Why Landmark: This is a restored home of the Rider Family, which was one of the original families of Salem Township. Caption Ira Rider came to Salem in 1830 and served as postmaster, assessor, supervisor and State Representative. Ira, the son, operated a sawmill. Fred, the grandson, built the house.

The Store



Landmark: The Store

Location: Six Mile Road in Salem Hamlet of Salem Township. On the Northwest corner of Six Mile and Salem Roads and Dickerson Road

Why Landmark: This building is one of the original buildings of the Salem Hamlet and is the only business structure still in use from this olden time. Mr. Albert F. Van Atta opened a General Store in it in 1876. The floor above the store was used for club meetings, parties, plays and dances. The store has been in continuous serve to the hamlet. Landmark: Salem Bible Church Location: 9481 Six Mile Road Salem Hamlet of Salem Township on the Northeast corner of Six Mile and Salem Roads
