Noon to 3 PM, and Food & Drinks will be available for purchase from Noon to 4 PM.

On November 6th, SAHS will be hosting a Fall Immunization Clinic, which will be administrated by Washtenaw County Public Health Department from 5 PM to 7 PM at the Jarvis-Stone School (7991 North Territorial Road at Curtis Road). Clinic is open to all. Nurses will be administrating the following:

- Flu shot = \$20 per person.
- Preservative-free Flu shot (ages 6 - 35 months) = \$20
- FluMist = \$25

Payment can be made by cash, check, or file a claim with Medicaid or Medicare Part B. More information can be found at the Washtenaw County's Website (http://www.ewashtenaw.org/government/departments/public_health/ph_fluclinics.html). You can download the flu shot form from that site, complete it and bring it to the clinic to speed up the process.

Pub Note: The first edition, with no date on the title page and the copyright dates on the maps running from 1831 to 1835. This issue is probably earlier than the LOC copy - the LOC copy has most of the pages numbered, while this copy has only a few pages numbered (and the numbers there are do not always correspond to the index numbers). Ristow states that Burr completed only eight of the 63 maps by 1832 and was then unable to complete the project because of his appointment to the U.S. Post Office as topographer; the atlas was completed by Illman and Pilbrow and issued in 1835. Burr is given credit on the title page, and the entire group of maps is in his "style" so we can assume he played at least a supervisory role in the production of the remaining maps. Full color.

Cwik's Note: This map was published ten years after the first land sale in Salem and two years before Michigan became a state. The shapes of Lakes Michigan and Huron are not as we know them today, but are better than the 1823 map. The border between the United States of American and Canada is very similar to today's border. Washtenaw County is still larger than today and many more counties were added to the west and north since the 1826 map with a total of 35 counties in Michigan. The current upper peninsula of Michigan was still part of the Northwest Territory and the northern portion of the current lower peninsular was labeled "Ottawas & Miamies" for the Indian tribes of the area.


Oldtime Summer Picnic and Croquet Match

Dickerson Barn Update

In July, the three doors to the Dickerson Barn were hung. The hinges are replicas of the type of hinges used in the 1830s. More of the floor has been arranged for securing by Gilbert Terry. We are planning on painting the Dickerson Barn a beautiful Barn Red during the fall. SAHS still needs to raise the last of the funds to complete this project. We are short of funds to complete the windows, drain, fence and painting as well as the landscaping. We still need about \$5,000.



Centennial Farm Program

The Michigan Centennial Farm Program is now being administered by the Historical Society of Michigan (HSM). In order for to have a farm certified as a Michigan Centennial Farm, the owner must submit a complete application package demonstrating that the farms meets the following criteria:

- It must be a working farm.
- It must have a minimum of ten acres
- Ownership must have remained in the same family for 100 or more consecutive years.
- The relationship of the present owner to the owner of 100 years ago must be clearly stated.
- The continuous family ownership must be documented.

A complete Centennial Farm Application must include:

- Photographs of the farmhouse and outbuildings, and an overall view of the complex of buildings;

- Documentation that demonstrates when the first family owner acquired the property and the continuous chain of title;
- A site plan of the property showing the location of farm structures and landscape features;
- Non-refundable application fee of \$75

If your farm meets the requirements listed above, Salem Area Historical Society would be willing to assist you in recognizing your family's historical achievement.

Local Historic District Designation
