Cwik's Note: This map was published forty-one years after the first land sale in Salem and twenty-nine years after Michigan became a state. This was one year after the end of the Civil War. Besides the color outlines for the State and Counties and an insert for Isle Royale, this map includes the Land Office; railroads; wagon roads; and the copper, iron and silver region.

Flu Immunization Clinic

On September 24th, SAHS will be hosting a Flu Immunization Clinic, which will be administrated by the Washtenaw County Public Health Department from 5 PM to 7 PM at the Jarvis-Stone School (7991 North Territorial Road at Curtis Road). Clinic is open to all. Nurses will be administrating the following:

- Flu shot = \$20 per person.
- Preservative-free Flu shot (ages 6 35 months) = \$20

Payment can be made by cash, check, or file a claim with Medicaid or Medicare Part B. More information can be found at the Washtenaw County's Website (http://www.ewashtenaw.org/government/departments /public_health/ph_fluclinics.html). You can download the flu shot form from that site, complete it and bring it to the clinic to speed up the process.

Jarvis-Stone School Update

Work is continuing on the renovation of the front room on the Jarvis-Stone School. In June, the SAHS Board hired Fairplay Home Maintenance, LLC (734-699-6976) to strip

the old roof and re-shingle it. The job was started and completed on June 6th. More work sessions for SAHS members



were held in July and August. The interior Stone wall was washed in the first work session. In the second, it was
