#### 2009 Annual Flu Immunization Clinic



**Pub Note:** The first Michigan State atlas. Full color. Bound in half leather brown cloth covers with title reading "Atlas of the State of Michigan" stamped in gold on the front and blind stamped on the back.

**Cwik's Note:** This map was published forty-eight years after the first land sale in Salem and thirty-six years after Michigan became a state. All of the lower peninsula's counties are as we known them today with the exception of Bay County, which will eventually be split to create Arenac County. There are only 8 upper peninsula counties. ### **SAHS 2010 Elections**

Salem Area Historical Society will be holding its annual elections as per its By-Laws during the first quarter of 2010. Articles IV, V and VI address this process. Article IV defines the annual meeting of the society as the one held in March. Article V specifies that the officers shall be installed at the annual meeting and defines the officers of the society as:

- President
- Vice-President
- Secretary
- Treasurer
- Officer At-Large

Article VI defines the nomination and election process. Article VI is as follows:

At a business meeting, two months before the annual meeting, a nominating committee shall be appointed. At the next meeting the nominating committee shall present a slate consisting of one or more nominees for each and every office. Nominations may also be made from the floor at this meeting. Nominations from the floor may not be made on the night of the election.

Officers shall be elected at the club's annual meeting. They shall assume their duties immediately following their installation and should have a meeting to plan activities for the coming club year.

Election shall be by secret ballot. Provided, however, in the event there is only one nominee for office, and no nominations from the floor, the secretary may be instructed to cast one ballot for the election of the said nominee.

A majority of votes cast for each office shall constitute an election for that office.

All vacancies in elective offices except presidency shall be filled by the president for the unexpired term.

As has been done in the past, we will follow the process as specified in our By-Laws. At the SAHS January 27<sup>th</sup> meeting, we will appoint a nominating committee. If you would like to be on this committee,

please contact one of the current officers of the society. Prior to our February 13<sup>th</sup> meeting, members who would like to nominate themselves to be a nominee for office should contact either the nominating committee or a current officer. All nominations must be self-nominating and all are accepted. A member need not be present at the February meeting to be a nominee. Nominations from the floor will be accepted at the February 13<sup>th</sup> meeting. The 2010 election will be held during our March 24<sup>th</sup> meeting. A nominee need not be present to be elected.

The current SAHS Board encourages all members to participate in this election process by being a member of the nominating committee, by being a nominee for an office and by voting.
