Following dinner, we will have our annual election and Show & Tell. Bring an item of historical importance to you and describe it to those attending the meeting.

At the April 28<sup>th</sup> meeting in the Jarvis Stone School, Kathleen Marcaccio will present her program on Margaret Mitchell and *Gone With The Wind*. Known to her fellow Windies as The *Gone With The Wind* Answer Lady, Marcaccio's presentation provides background information on author Margaret Mitchell and her Pulitzer Prize-winning novel *Gone With The Wind*; the 1939 blockbuster film by the same name; Margaret Mitchell's post-*GWTW* life; and *Gone With The Wind* in popular culture. Admission is free for SAHS members and \$2 for non-members.

The May 26<sup>th</sup> meeting will be held in the Jarvis Stone School and Susan Nenadic will give a presentation about Michigan pioneers prior to statehood. "Michigan Mania" concerns the early settlement of Southeast Michigan especially Washtenaw County. The title comes from Harriet Noble's memoir in which she describes the frenzy to go to Michigan as a mania. Unlike most discussions, this one emphasizes the neglected role and experiences of women, but even that implicitly contains the experiences of men, too, since most women came with husbands.

was followed by a short business meeting. The election slate of offices for 2010 was presented and accepted. A silent auction was followed by a live auction.





Cwik's Note: This map was published fifth-five years after the first land sale in Salem and forty-three years after Michigan became a state. The main street of Woodward Avenue, Jefferson Avenue, Gratiot, Grand River Avenue and Michigan are well established. The city has not yet built out to the present day Grand Boulevard.
