

Pub Note: This was Rand McNally's highwater mark for its 19th century atlases. No obvious changes from the 1896 edition. Similar to the 1897 Standard Atlas of the World. Vol 1 - Foreign Countries, Vol 2 - United States. Map in full printed color. Atlas is bound in green cloth covers with "The Rand-McNally indexed atlas of the world. Foreign countries" and " ... United States" stamped in gilt on Volumes 1 and 2, respectively. **Cwik's Note:** The city limits are about where Grand Boulevard is today. Grand Circus Park exists. On the east side, there is a bridge to Belle Isle, Elmwood and Mt. Elliot Cemeteries and Owen Park. On the west side, there is Clark Park (south of Dix), Cass Park and Voight Park.
