The Packard Proving Grounds is managed and supported by the Packard Motor Car Foundation, a 501c3 nonprofit Corporation. The mission of the Packard Proving Grounds Historic Site is to preserve the legacy of the Packard Motor Car Company through the restoration and preservation of the Packard Proving Grounds, educating future generations about America's automotive history.

A 560-acre (2.3 km²) site in the Charter Township of Shelby about 20 miles due north of the Packard factory, was procured and noted Detroit architect Albert Kahn was retained to design the buildings of the facility, which opened in 1928 and was operated by Packard until August 15, 1956.
